

For more than 37 years, La Margarita has served authentic Mexican cuisine. Owners Xochitl and Javier Muñoz took over operations in 2012, when Xochitl's father, Pedro Rosales, retired. The restaurant had to lay off most of their workers at the start of the pandemic and shifted to exclusively offering takeout. Since then, they've been able to rehire most of their workers and resume indoor service. But, with state workers still working remotely, it is much slower than it used to be.

Restaurant owners must work hard to get through this uncertain time, Javier says. Loyal staff, faithful customers, and great food has helped the restaurant endure.



The Duck House Chinese restaurant in southwest Portland is more than an eatery — it's a community. "The hardest part about the pandemic was not being able to serve our customers. We have a lot of regulars who dine with us several times a month," says owner Harvey Liu, who opened the restaurant specializing in Szechuan cuisine in 2016.

During the pandemic, the restaurant quickly adapted to takeout and delivery only. It also followed strong safety protocols such as one-way entry and exits for customers, sanitized pens, and hand sanitizers. "I'm so proud of our staff," says Harvey.

Around late June 2021, the restaurant reopened to dine-in customers, who can once again enjoy the food and atmosphere. "We're blessed to have a diverse base of customers," says Harvey. "Especially during dinner hours, there's fantastic energy at Duck House."


